OUTLINE OF SERMONETTE

DELIVERED OVER PADIO STATION KORE, EUGENE, OREGON week beginning October 9, 1933 by Herbert W. Armstrong

THURSDAY MORNING: 10/12/33 FT8

Text, Galations 3:27-29: "For as many of you as have been baptized into Christ have put on Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither bond nor free, there is neither male nor female: for ye are all one in Christ Jesus. AND IF YE BE CHRIST'S, THEN ARE YE ABRAHAM'S SEED, AND HEIRS ACCORDING TO THE PROMISE."

This text is really little understood. First, as to what the PROMISE is. Second, as to WHY we have to be Abraham's seed to inherit the promises. Third, as to WHEN we shall inherit them; and fourth, why they are all inherited only thru Christ.

To really understand these points, let us study the 8th verse of the 15th chapter of Romans: "Jesus Christ was a minister of the circumcision for the truth of God, TO CONFIRM THE PROMISES MADE UNTO THE FATHERS. A clear understanding of this text will greatly increase our knowledge of Christ and of the Gospel of the KINCPOM which He preached. Notice, Jesus was a minister for the truth of God. In other words, the learned yesterday morning, a Messenger sent from God with a message, which message is the TRUTH. Then note again, He was a minister, or messanger, TO CONFIRM THE PROMISES MADE UNTO THE FATHERS. The preached the GOSPFL OF THE KINGDOM and commanded all ministers to be preaching that gospel and not any other. Then the PROMISES MADE UNTO THE FATHERS has something to do with that Gospel.

Let us now consider, I, WHO are the Fathers? II, WHAT are the promises made to them? and III, WHEN do we share in their inheritance, and IV, HOW may we inherit them?

I. WHO are the Fathers?

The Lord commanded Moses to say, as recorded in Exodus 3:15: "The Lord God of your fathers, the God of ABRAHAM, the God of ISAAC, the God of JACOB." Then Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob are the fathers. And Peter said, while greaching in the Temple after the day of Pentecost, (The Saither God of Abraham, and of Isaac, and of Jacob, the God of CUR FATHERS." And Paul says, in Romans 4:16,17, "to that also which is of the faith of Abraham; who is the father of us all, (As it is written, I have made these a father of many nations,)." (Details quotation from tots 3:16). And again in Galations 3:18: "Now to Abraham and his seed were the PROMISES made." So there should be no misunderstanding as to WHO the fathers are. They are Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.

II. WHAT are the promises made to them?

We will now have to turn back into the book of Genesis to find the account of the promises made to Abraham. Isaso, and Jacob, First, let us see what promises were made to Abraham. Genesis 12:1.5-7: "Now the Lord had said unto Abram, get thee out of thy country, and from thy lindred, and from thy father's house, unto a LAND that I will show thee. I have and Abram took Sarai his wife, and Lot his brother's son, and all their substance that they had gathered, and the souls that they had gotten in Haran; and they went forth to go into the land of Canaan; and into the land of Ganaan they came. . And the Canaanite was in the land.

And the Lord appearmed unto Abram, and said, "Unto thy seed will I give THIS land." Now some seem to believe that "land" means heaven. A man once told me that "land" in these promises did not mean land, it meant "perce, and joy, and happiness," but I am sure that those of you who are farmers will not altogether agree today that the word "land" means peace and joy and happiness. But to make certain, notice the text. Abraham was in "the land of Canaan." And "the Canaanite was then in the land." It is the land wherein the Canaanites then dwelt --- the land where Abraham journeyed to, right on THIS EARTH -- and the Lord made him a PROMISE: "Unto thy seed WILL I CIVE THIS LAND." The promise, then, was the promise of possession of land, and it was THIS land, the land where Abraham then dwelt.

Now let us notice the 13th chapter, the 1xx 14th and 15th verses.

"And the Lord said unto Abram, after that Lot was separated from him,
Lift up now thine eyes, and look from the place where thou art northward, and southward, and eastward, and westward: for all the land which
thou SEEST, to thee will I give it, and to thy seed FOREVER. We here
the promise is of the land Abraham could SEE from where he stood in
the land of Canaan. Notice Cod will give it to him, and his seed,
FOREVER.

How turn to the 15th chapter of Genesis, verses 2.5-7, and 16.

"And Abram said, Lord God, what wilt thou give me, seeing I go childless?

. And he brought him forth abroad and said, Lock now toward heaven, and tell the stars, if thou be able to number them: and he said unto him, So shall thy seed be. And he BYLIEVED in the Lord; and He counted it to him for righteousness. And He said unto him, I am the Lord that brought thee out of Ur of the Chaldees, to give thee THIS land to inherit it. A Again the promise is THIS LAND, and not some other land.

And Abraham is to INHEPIT IT. And verse 18 makes it more plain:

JIn the same day the Lord made a covenant with Abram, eaving, Unto thy seed have I given this land, from the river of Egypt unto the great river, the river Euphrates. The promised land, then, is from the Nils river in Egypt, in Afrida, to the Euphrates river, in Asia, which empties into the Persian gulf.

And again in the 17th chapter, the first two and girlth verses, are the promises re-promised to Abraham: *And when Abram was ninety years old and nine, the Lord appeared to Abram, and said unto him, I am the Almighty God; walk before me and be thou perfect. And I will make my covenant between me and thee, and will multiply thee exceedingly . . . neither shall thy name any more be called Abram, but thy name shall be Abraham; for a father of many nations have I made thee . . And I will give unto THEE, and to thy seed after thee, the LAND WHEREIN THOU ART A STRANGER, all the land of Canaan, for an EVERLASTING POSSESSION. So God as said He would give the land where Abraham then dwelt as a stranger, the specific land of Canaan, to Abraham for an EVERLASTING possession.

Now notice how God re-promised the same promise to Issac. It is in Genesis 26:3: And Issac went . . . and the Lord oppeared unto him, and said, . . . Sojourn IN THIS LAND, and I will be with thee, and will expless thee; for unto thee, and unto thy seed, I will give all these countries, and I will perform the oath which I sware unto Abrahama thy father. "

And again God re-promised the same promise to Jacob. Gen. 28:13:

"And behold the Lord . . . said, I am the Lord God of Abraham thy lather,
and the God of Target the lord suppose about I recome to the same will I recome

Now a peculiar point I want you to notice carefully, is that Abraham died without having ever received that promise — and he has never yet, to this day, received the promised inheritance. For proof of this, turn to the 7th chapter of Acts, the 2nd to the 5th verses: It is in XXXXX Stephen's desense, when he was falsely accused before the council at Jerusalem: "And he said, Man, brethren, and fathers, hearken; The God of glory appeared unto our father Abraham, when he was in Mesopotamia, beforehe dwelt in Charan, and said unto him, Get thee out of thy country, and from thy kindred, and come into the land which I shall show thee. Then came he out of the land of the Cheldeans, and dwelt in Charan: and from thense, when his father was dead, he removed him INTO THIS LAND WHEREIN YE NOW DWELL. 3 (Notice, it was the land where the Jews dwelt after the crucifixion of Christ — the land of which Jerusalem was the capital.) "And he gave him none inheritance in it, no, not so much as to set his foot on: yet He promised that He WOULD give it to him for a possession, and to his seed after him."

Now notice also Habrews BY 11:8-13: #By faith Abraham, when he was called to go out into a place which he should AFTER receive for an inheritance, obeyed; and he want out, not knowing whither he went. By faith he sojourned in the land of promise, as in a strange country, dwelling in tebernacies with Isaac and Jacob, the heirs with him of the same promise: . . These ALL FIED IN FAITH. NOT HAVING RECEIVED THE promises, but having seen them afar off.

now WHEN will Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob receive the promised land, and WHEN do we share in the promised inheritance, and HOW may we inherit the promises with Abraham? These quanties we shall be been because marning.
